Key Learnings

- Began with outreach to multifamily property managers and providing CFL's for install during maintenance calls
- o Duke shifted to direct-install program (via 3rd party vendor), adding water efficiency measures
- Properties are identified through install vendor and through apartment associations and property management companies
- Duke vendor conducts outreach, site visits, qualifications and installs all at no cost to property owner
- o Program has expanded significantly in recent years, with more than 100,000 units served.
- o Property owners/managers who pay water utilities for tenants see direct benefit in savings.
- Property owners/managers also benefit from reduced maintenance costs and efforts and improved customer satisfaction by helping tenants save energy and money.
